History of the cooperation between CTIF and GFMC in building specialized fire management capacity for fire & rescue services in Europe and globally (I)

- Forest Fires Commission (FFC) founded in 1986, led by France until 2003
 - Reactivation meeting @ CTIF Annual Meeting, Budapest, Hungary, 18 September 2003
 - Mr. Trond Rane (Norway) taking over interim leadership of FFC
 - Followed by second revival meeting in Sarpsborg, Norway, 28-30 November 2003



History of the cooperation between CTIF and GFMC (II)

Planned CTIF-FFC conference »*Expériences de la saison d'incendies de 2002 – 2003: Sommes-nous préparés à ce défi?*» in the frame of "Sauveteur 2004" (Wels, Austria, 9 October 2004) was cancelled due to lack of international participation and because that conference was organized by a commercial entity

- 3rd FFC meeting @ GFMC 28-23 January 2005
 - Mr. Mark Jones (UK) taking over leadership of FFC

- First Introduction of an idea to create a "*European Wildland Fire Management Handbook*" for Fire and Rescue Services, development to be sponsored by the EU Leonardo da Vinci programme



History of the cooperation between CTIF and GFMC (III)

 2005-2006: Preparation of a proposal to develop the "European Wildland Fire Management Handbook" for Fire and Rescue Services through EU Leonardo da Vinci programme. Granted in 2006 and re-designated "EuroFire Competency Standards":

- Project timeframe: 1 October 2006 31 December 2008
- Total volume EU grant: € 200,000
- In-kind contribution by GFMC: € 28,000
- In-kind and cash contribution by CTIF (through Essex County Fire and Rescue Service, UK): € 18,000
- Project Management:

Rural Development Initiatives (UK)







History of the cooperation between CTIF and GFMC (IV)

- 2007-2010: Three meetings of FFC to accompany the development of the EuroFire Competency Standards
- May 2007: Sevilla, Spain, at 4th International Wildland Fire Conference
- October 2008: Thessaloniki, Greece





History of the cooperation between CTIF and GFMC (V)

 May 2010: Finalization meeting of *EuroFire Competency* Standards, hand-over of FFC Chairmanship from Mark Jones (UK) to Harvard Sormoen (N)

Key Definitions

Learning Outcome	Statement of what a learner knows, understands and is able to do on completion of a learning process, defined in terms of knowledge, skills and competence
Knowledge	Body of facts, principles, theories and practises that is related to a field of study or work. Can be theoretical or factual.
Skills	Ability to apply knowledge & know-how to complete tasks & solve problems. Can be cognitive or practical.
Competence	Proven ability to use knowledge, skills & personal abilities. Described in terms of responsibility & autonomy (level descriptors)


























The UNISDR Global Wildland Fire Network

History of the Cooperation in Forest Fire Management in the SE Europe / Caucasus / Middle East Region (I)

- The Regional SE Europe / Caucasus Wildland Fire
 Network has been established in 2005 one year after the
 First Regional Conference in Turkey 2004
- The network has created a thematic platform in the region and an ongoing dialogue between the participating countries, involving:
 - fire scientists
 - fire managers and
 - national agencies responsible for fire management / wildfire disaster risk reduction








History of the Cooperation in Forest Fire Management in the SE Europe / Caucasus / Middle East Region (III)

- In 2010 the Regional SE Europe / Caucasus Fire Monitoring Center (RFMC) has been established
- Location: Skopje, FYR Macedonia
- The network and RFMC constitute a regional activity within the Global Wildland Fire Network





History of the Cooperation in Forest Fire Management in the SE Europe / Caucasus / Middle East Region (IV)

Main objectives of the Regional Network and the RFMC (I)

 Facilitation of transboundary cooperation in fire management

 Provision of a regional database on fire-relevant information (wildland fire science, management, statistical databases)

 Networking with providers of data and information on early warning, fire danger rating, satellite derived fire information (pre-, during and post-fire) History of the Cooperation in Forest Fire Management in the SE Europe / Caucasus / Middle East Region (V)

Main objectives of the Regional Network and the RFMC (II)

- Provision of information to requesting parties
- Fire situation assessments / advisory support in emergency situations
- Capacity building at all levels
- Supporting development of national and international public policies

History of the Cooperation in Forest Fire Management in the SE Europe / Caucasus / Middle East Region (VI)

Partners

- Main partner: Global Fire Monitoring Center (GFMC)
- UN umbrella: UN Strategy for Disaster Reduction (UNISDR)
- Political mandate: UN Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) Team of Specialists on Forest Fire
- Finances: Supported by the Council of Europe (CoE), through its Euro-Mediterranean Major Hazards Agreement (EUR-OPA)

History of the Cooperation in Forest Fire Management in the SE Europe / Caucasus / Middle East Region (VII)

Achievements – Examples (I):

 Continuous expansion of networking in the Balkan region, adjoining Eastern European countries (Ukraine and Russia), South Caucasus, and recently the Middle East

- Drafting of a regional agreement on cooperation in fire management
- National capacity building in fire management
- Regional capacity building in fire management

History of the Cooperation in Forest Fire Management in the SE Europe / Caucasus / Middle East Region (VIII)

Achievements – Examples (II):

- Advisory support during wildfire crises:
 - Nagorno-Karabakh conflict (2006)
 - Extreme fire summer 2007 in the Balkans
 - Georgia armed conflict (2008)
- Follow-up through OSCE and the Environment and Security Initiative (ENVSEC)
