### FIRENET

FireNet is an email-based discussion and information distribution system, or listserv, specifically serving the wildland fire global community. This is a free service for subscribers who will receive monthly email reminders concerning their user name and password and how to modify their subscription if necessary including unsubscribing if desired.

Originally managed by Dr. Chris Trevitt at the Australian National University (ANU), FireNet had enjoyed a significant following of wildland fire professionals going back to 1996.

In June of 2002 after discussions with Dr. Trevitt it was agreed to transfer management of FireNet to the IAWF. Because of other job responsibilities Dr. Trevitt had determined he did not have the time to devote to the proper running of a listserv. It was felt by the IAWF that the adoption of FireNet would help fulfill part of our Mission Statement: "Facilitating communication and providing leadership to the wildland fire community."

Posted messages go out to

the entire global network. We do not allow blatant advertisements for commercial products or messages with degrading language or images. All posts are viewed and approved by a moderator, currently Chuck Bushey, before release to help eliminate unwanted intrusion to FireNet subscribers.

In 1992 the IAWF began the in-house publishing of two periodicals, <u>Wildfire</u> magazine and the <u>International Journal of Wildland Fire</u>. It is now 14 years later and both publications are still going strong. While professional publishing houses now actually produce both, they remain "official publications of the IAWF". We

have an Editorial Advisory Committee for each, which provide advice, assistance, and expertise as needed.

Wildfire magazine is the credible resource that wildland managers and chief officers use in their efforts against urban-interface and wildland fires. Wildfire addresses is-

sues at the local, state and federal levels and provides a unique international perspective.

The <u>Journal</u> publishes new and significant papers that advance basic and applied research concerning wildland fire.

# OUR WEBSITE AND THE WILDLAND FIRE EVENT CALENDAR

There have been several changes and improvements on our web site at www.iawfonline.org The Conferences pages have been beefed up, the FireNet subscription page has been improved, and we have links to wildland fire books at Amazon.com.
