
Economic & Climate Changes and Fire – The Tropics – Key Issues

Wildfires: Increasing need for response by ground and aerial means, e.g. desiccating wetlands / protected areas












Temperate Zone – Example Europe

Certified Villages: Eligible for aerial fire protection












