Firefighting Equipment and Training Support to District Forest Offices

1. Introduction

Forest fire is emerging as a big problem in Nepal making vulnerable to lives, livelihoods, and biodiversity. The fire is emerging as one of the major challenges threatening sustainable management of forest, destroying of species of both flora and fauna in Nepal. This has direct implication in live and livelihoods of local people who are dependent on forest resources for their livelihoods. District forest offices and other concerned stakeholders at local level lack fire fighting tools and equipments. Therefore, an immediate response is needed to provide Firefighting Equipment and Training Support to District Forest Offices to control on-going fire situation in different part of the country.

An agreement has been signed between the Multi Stakeholder Forestry Programmed (MSFP), Lalitpur and Nepal Forest Fire Management Chapter (NFMC), Lalitpur in 3 May 2012 to provide 10 Sets of fire-fighting tools/ equipments and provide orientation training to DFO professional each in **Kapilvastu, Dang** and **Dailekh** districts to strengthen DFOs to response the forest fires as a model works in the MSFP project area and other vulnerable districts.

2. Objectives

The main objective of this emergency assistance is to equip District Forest Offices with fire fighting tools and equipment which enable them to mobilise the local resources with equipment for controlling forest fire.

The scope and approach of the work are:

- Prepare the fire fighting tools and equipment
- Orient DFO staffs about the use of these tools and equipment

The expected deliverables are:

- Three district forest offices are equipped with firefighting tools and equipment
- Lesser the incidence of forest fire in the supported districts
- DFO staffs oriented with the use of firefighting tolls and equipment

3. Program Implementation and outputs

The programme (implementation plan is given in **Table 1**) was implemented as follows:

1. Provided a set of fire fighting tools and equipments (**Table 2**) to three district forest Offices (Kapilvastu, Dang and Dailekh)
2. Provided orientation training to DFO Staffs/ local community about use of those tools/ equipments effectively.

Box 1: An overview of the Programme

Tools and equipment were arranged (manufactured/ purchased) locally except backpack pumps (water bag) which is being imported from Spain and reaching to Nepal in 20 May 2013 (expected).

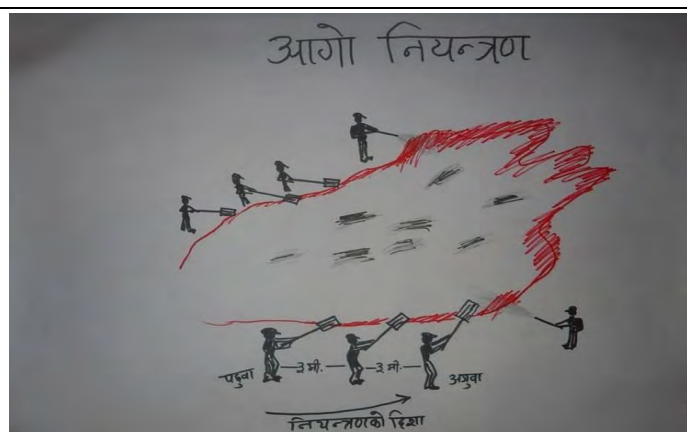


Fig 1: Fire fighting strategy

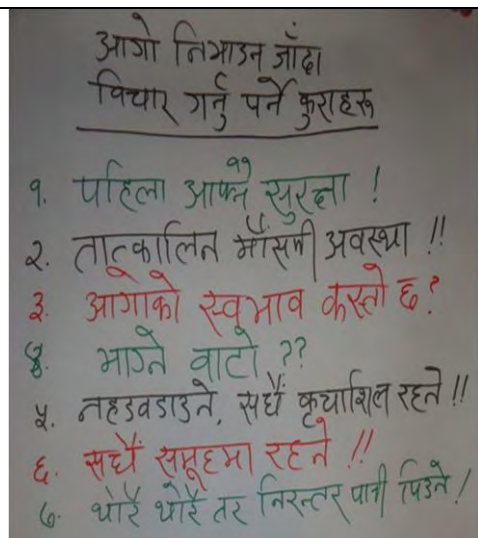


Fig 2: Safety measures for fire fighting

The training course, *inter alia*, took into account of safety and ergonomic aspects in fire management, including uses of appropriate fire fighting tools and safety gears (**Fig 1 and 2**).

Major topics covered in the orientation training to use fire fighting tools/equipments are as follows:

- Fire situation assessment
- Fire prevention and suppression
- Fire behaviour and prescribed burning
- Fire safety and welfare
- Proper use of fire fighting tools and equipments
