Report of the Meeting UNISDR Regional Southeast Europe / Caucasus Wildland Fire Network

Skopje, Republic Macedonia, 4-6 December 2008

10 January 2009

Objectives of the meeting

- Regional South East Europe/Caucasus consultation meeting on "Review the fire situation in the region in 2007-2008"
- 2) Preparatory Meeting for the 2009 Regional Training Course: Fire Management on Terrain contaminated by Unexploded Ordnance (UXO), Land Mines and Radioactivity

The meeting took place at the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Economy, Skopje. The Coordinator of the Meeting UNISDR Regional Southeast Europe / Caucasus Wildland Fire Network, Mr. Nikola Nikolov, welcomed the attendees of the meeting on behalf of the minister and of the network.

The Director of the Global Fire Monitoring Center (GFMC), Mr. Johann G. Goldammer, coordinator of the Global Wildland Fire Network, explained the background and objectives of the meeting and acknowledged the sponsorship and financial support by the Council of Europe, Secretariat of the Euro-Mediterranean Major Hazards Agreement (EUR-OPA), and the Environment and Security Initiative (ENVSEC). ENVESEC is a joint initiative addressing the links between the natural environment and human security. ENVSEC partners include the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE), North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and the Regional Environmental Center for Central and Eastern Europe (REC).

Country Reports

In the first part of the meeting the representatives of countries of the region presented reports on the wildland fire situation.

Albania

- Report about the reforms in the forestry sector: Forestry is now under the Ministry for Environment
- Statistics
 - 2006: 176 fires, 767 ha forest, 314 ha pastures; damage 1 Mio Euro

The GFMC is serving as Secretariat of the UN-ISDR Global Wildland Fire Network and the UN-ISDR Wildland Fire Advisory Group – an advisory body to the United Nations affiliated to the UN International Strategy for Disaster Reduction (UN-ISDR) and Member of the Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction.

The GFMC is an Associated Institute of the United Nations University (UNU).



- 2007: 1190 fires, 2700 ha state forests, 2860 ha communal forest, 310 ha private forests,
 6263 ha pastures, damage 20 Mio Euro; 35.000 ha total affected; EU JRC reporting based on satellite imagery that more than 100,000 ha of vegetated land had been affected
- 2008: 348 fires, 274 in forests, 74 in pastures; 742 ha state forests, 479 ha communal, 254 ha private forests, 2716 ha pastures; damage 11 mio Euros.
- Causes: 54% unknown, 20 intentional, 26% negligence
- Risk Emergency Commission formed at inter-agency level
- Foreign support2007: Italy (2 Canadairs), Ukraine (limited impact, old airplanes), Greece (air and terrestrial support), Germany (2 helicopters, limited value)
- National helicopters: no trained pilots, no Bambi buckets
- Conclusions: Aerial support too expensive, useless
- International help good, but no good coordination internally.
- Problems:
 - Efficiency of human and material resources
 - Logistics
 - Access to forest, topography
 - Vacuum ownership
 - Fires in private forest, people are interested to harvest; burned intentionally for salvage logging
 - Fire as management tool needs to be allowed, legislation to be improved
- Underlying causes: 65% population was in rural areas, now less than 50%
- Future needs:
 - Effective management plans
 - Strengthening initial attack
 - Rapid detection and monitoring system
 - Fire as management tool
 - Implementation of fire policy and strategy in 2002

Armenia

- Apologies of representative of Ministry for Defence not attending
- 2006: 299.5 ha burned, more detailed statistics available in presentation
- Construction of fire prevention road
- Fires on border lines 2008: March and August 2008
- HALO TRUST should have statistics on areas contaminated by mines and UXO
- Reports about land mine explosions during fires
- Recommendations: Meeting of experts and establishment of operative connection addressing fires on border minefields
- Equipment: Already 2 off-road vehicles purchased. Fire mainly put out manually.

Azerbaijan

- Country size: 86,000 km², 12% forested
- 2007: 626 ha forest burned, 3606 ha straw burning
- 2008: 46.8 ha forest fires, 3338 ha straw burning
- Animals rescued 2007: 182 2008: 630; animals killed by fires 2007: 35- 2008: 94
- Fire suppression: 2007. 86 MAN fire trucks received from Germany, 90 Iveco from France
- One Be 200 scooping water bomber and 2 Helicopters Mi-17 available
- Special group created with firefighters and medical, engineers (construction) team. They have international passport. Group can be dispatched internationally for mutual fire disaster assistance

Bosnia and Herzegovina

- 2008: 355 forest fires in state forests; 5400 ha affected; 2 million Euro damage
- Minefields: 220,000 ha in forests and forest lands
- Radioactive contamination: Some spots from the last war (consequences of NATO use of ammunition with depleted uranium)
- 3 phases of activities:
 - Phase 1: Prevention, mine clearing, people casualties in mine clearing
 - Phase 1: Rescue of people and property at risk
 - Phase 3: Removal of adverse effects

Bulgaria

- Fires last 7 years 100,000 ha affected; 2000: 57,000 ha, 1710 fires
- 2007: 1479 firs, 43,000 ha; 3 people killed, 1 injured, thereof 6 firefighters
- 19-30 July 2007 peak; disaster declaration in 11 municipalities; 51 houses burned, 21 families evacuated
- 2008: 577 fires, area burned 5272 ha
- Causes 2007: Negligence 62%, Arson:3.8, Natural: 1.4%, Technical faults: 4%, Unknown: 15.6%
- Multilateral Assistance 2007: Call to MIC request aerial means. MIC no means available. 2nd part of August: Assistance by Russia IL-76. One week. Not the best aircraft for use in mountains, they dropped from high altitude.
- Fires in 2008: Rila National Park, MIC request. 2 Canadairs from France. More successful than IL-76.
- European fleet: We have to think more about prevention.

Croatia

- 2007: 1694 fires, 67,682 ha affected, 118 million Euros damage
- Subsequently: Increase from 5000 to 6200 firefighters
- Country host of the international conference ""Fire Fighting in Open Spaces New Methods and Approaches", Makarska, Republic of Croatia, 9-11 December 2008 (see Annex)

Georgia

- Report on general forest fire issues in the country
- 2008: 1269.5 ha burned, 32 fires during the summer
- GFMC also giving a brief report on the OSCE-led assessment mission of the fires occurring during the war in August 2008

Ukraine

- Increasing of forest in regions that were without forests before: Afforestations
- 2007 fires: Dune forests. Kherson fires. 7800 ha burned. President intervening during the fires and also showing interest in reforestation activities in fall 2007
- Call of aerial assistance only in mountains, often too late. AN-32 water bomber sometimes efficient, however, slow reloading water.
- Incident 2007: Chief forester and wife dies in fires due to smoke exposure
- East Ukraine radioactivity contamination: Consequence of nuclear weapons tests in the 1960s. Consequence of rain over the nuclear clouds. Low contamination.
- High contamination in the Chernobyl Exclusion Zone. Well mapped.
- Description of 2007-2008 activities: Two national round tables on the problem of forest fires in the exclusion zone (supported by GFMC, Yale University, and Chopivsky Family Foundation)

Turkey

- Country with 21 million ha forests, 17 000 villages in or near forested areas with population of 8.8 million.
- Increase of fire incidents in the past years
- Fire causes: 5% lightning, negligence 45%, arson 13%, unknown 37%
- Gas has replaced fuelwood use
- 2008: 20,000 ha forest fire near Antalya
- Unprecedented and unique: 10 km spotting!
- 01 Aug 2008: destroyed by fire 77 households, 88 barnyards, 50 animals, 106 beehives, 2 people (resisting evacuation)
- Suppression by 9 helicopters, two fixed wing aircraft, five other a/c, 1300 firemen
- Discussion: Any role of terrorism activities
